Message from the Headteacher

Firstly, I need to say a big WELL DONE and THANK YOU to all our Year 6 students this week. They have shown true determination, perseverance and hard work in completing all of their SATs tests. We know that you all showed your very best in each assessment and are proud of all of your achievements. I also need to thank the staff who helped create a calm, purposeful, atmosphere for the children, including those who helped with preparations and invigilated the sessions. Over the last two weeks, we have welcomed a number of our Governors into school. They have attended workshops, been talking to pupils about school life and learning, as well as being a support during SATS week. A huge thank-you to our Governors for their continued support and time given.

While our Year 6 children have been working hard this week on their SATs, the rest of the school have continued with their own hard work and learning in their classes.

In addition, trips and outside visits are continuing. The Year 2s had a wonderful day at the National Motor Museum in Gaydon, Warwickshire. They started off by being car designers, making their own Lego model and then tested it down three different tracks to investigate durability and speed. They then went on a tour of the exhibition to see a car cut in half, a Lego life-size car and one of the oldest surviving buses, Bessie. We got dressed up in Victorian clothing and climbed aboard for a sing-song. We finished the amazing day with a tour of the interactive car section and to see a replica of the very first car ever built, the Patent Benz Motorwagen built by Karl Benz. There was so much to see. Sadly, we didn't get time for it all and as the coach pulled away a few children had already nodded off!

On Wednesday, Year 5 took part in a Rugby Tournament, and we were so proud of the way they represented the school. They demonstrated excellent teamwork and sportsmanship. Well done Year 5!

Year 6 ended their week with a well-deserved afternoon of fun at the park.

Next Thursday, 22nd May, we will be opening the gates at 3pm to provide an opportunity for parents and carers to come and view their children's work. You are invited to come to your child's classroom to see what they have been learning, then to depart through the school hall, where we will have our whole school art gallery ready for viewing. The children are rightfully proud of what they have produced and can't wait to show you.
